### What is Spectrum Foundation?



Spectrum Foundation gives out **funding**, or **money**. We give to projects that **support disabled people** and their **whānau**.



The Foundation does this **once** every **year**.

We try to give out over **\$1 Million** of funding each year.

### **Application information**



- For political reasons
- To build finances or capital
- To help with debt
- To just support spiritual or religious activities.
- To just gain more money



We like to fund registered charities.

**Contact** us if you would like to apply for funding but you are **not** a **registered** charity.

### **How to apply**


# 1. Send us an Expression of Interest

- An Expression of Interest is a form.
- It tells us why you want funding.
- We look at the forms and make choices based on our funding criteria.
- Funding criteria is a list of rules.
- This list helps us know who we want to support.





We will **contact** you **quickly** to let you know if you meet the **criteria**.



Everyone who applies needs to **measure** their **impact**.

This means you need to **show** how you have **helped**, or will help in the **future**.

Make sure all your **costs** in your Expression of Interest include **GST**.



If you apply late, we might not look at your form.

We are still **allowed** to accept **late** applications.

If you want to apply:

- **Download** and **complete** the Word form.
- Email your finished form to <u>info@spectrumfoundation.org.nz</u>
- Send it before **5pm**, **Friday 30**<sup>th</sup> **June**.
- Send the form back as a **Word** document.

### 2. Funding Application form



When we get your **Expression** of **Interest** form,

And if your project **meets** our funding **criteria**:

- We will ask you to **fill** in a **Funding Application** form.
- We will send you this form.
- We might help you to complete it.

We may also **need**:


- Financial information
- **Employee** information
- Impact information

We will **tell** you what **information** we need.



When your funding application is **finished**:

Please send it back to us.





When it is **finished**, we will **submit** your application.

We will update you on the progress.

### **Funding Criteria**

Spectrum Foundation likes to fund activities that are hard to access.

#### The areas we focus on are:



- Supporting access to health and wellbeing
- Supporting access to housing
- Supporting access to education
- Supporting access to employment
- Supporting mana and self-determination

#### Other areas:



- We like supporting programmes that use
   Enabling Good Lives (EGL) principles
- If you can show you know and respect the principles of Te Tiriti o Waitangi
- What impact the programme can already
   show it has had
- If the programme is long or short-term
- What community the programme will help



#### How we choose what to fund:

Spectrum Foundation works with a panel.

The panel is a **group** of people:

Including those with lived experience of disability.

The panel **look** at the **applications**.

They **choose** who they want to **fund**.

Final funding is **chosen** by the **Board**.



The Board does **not** have to **approve** any **application**.



The Board can **choose** who to give the **money** to.

Spectrum Foundation can **change** the due **dates**.

We will **tell** you if anything **changes**.



- Expressions of Interest is due before 5pm,
  Friday 30<sup>th</sup> June.
- Funding application is due before 5pm, Friday
   28<sup>th</sup> July.
- We will tell you if we have chosen you by
   Friday 29<sup>th</sup> September 2023.

## Where does the money go?

We give money to projects that support disabled people and their whanau.

We usually fund projects that are hard to access.

### Where does the money come from?



Our funding comes from:

- Investments
- Fundraising
- Service fees from our sister companies:
  - Spectrum Care and Homes of Choice.

What funding is available in this round? We want to give out up to \$800k.



### Why does it take three months?

We want to make positive change.

We chose carefully with our panel.



This group includes people with lived experience of disability.

Then it is looked at by the board.

We want to make sure we help the most impactful projects in the best way.



- We want time to give feedback on applications.
- We want to help people fill out their applications.
- We know that choosing who to fund has big impacts.
- We want to give time to make these important choices.

How long does it take to get the money if you are chosen?



- If you have been chosen, we will try to give you the money quickly.
- We will contact you quickly after a Board meeting to talk about your application.
